Between the Chaos and His Coming

Dear Friend,

I have never been so excited about our destiny in Christ. We are moving closer to the inevitable return of Jesus with every passing day. The violent images that we see currently on every form of media should not serve as a discouragement, but rather our joy of the promises of Christ being fulfilled. The end result will be something more wonderful than mankind can imagine.

What the world sees as dread, fear, and discouragement, we as believers ought to see as the joy of His promise to return coming to pass. Jesus spoke of many different signs that would earmark His return and the change of this dispensation, but there are two of which that seem to be very prevalent at this time.

In Luke chapter 17, Jesus spoke about His second coming. He describes what it will look like by comparing it to two different times in the Old Testament – the time in which Noah lived, and time in which Lot lived.

Luk 17:26 And as it was in the days of Noe, so shall it be also in the days of the Son of man.

Luk 17:27 They did eat, they drank, they married wives, they were given in marriage, until the day that Noe entered into the ark, and the flood came, and destroyed them all.

Luk 17:28 Likewise also as it was in the days of Lot; they did eat, they drank, they bought, they sold, they planted, they builded;

Luk 17:29 But the same day that Lot went out of Sodom it rained fire and brimstone from heaven, and destroyed *them* all.

Luk 17:30 Even thus shall it be in the day when the Son of man is revealed.

The archetypes of the generations in which these two men lived were violence and perversion. If we look at Genesis chapter 6, we see that it outlines for us the extreme violence that was in the days of Noah.

Gen 6:9 These *are* the generations of Noah: Noah was a just man *and* perfect in his generations, *and* Noah walked with God.

Gen 6:10 And Noah begat three sons, Shem, Ham, and Japheth.

Gen 6:11 The earth also was corrupt before God, and the earth was filled with violence.

Gen 6:12 And God looked upon the earth, and, behold, it was corrupt; for all flesh had corrupted his way upon the earth.

Gen 6:13 And God said unto Noah, The end of all flesh is come before me; for the earth is filled with violence through them; and, behold, I will destroy them with the earth.

The book of Jude and 2 Peter help us understand the characteristic perversions of Lot's day and the city of Sodom in which he lived.

Jud 1:7 Even as Sodom and Gomorrah, and the cities about them in like manner, giving themselves over to fornication, and going after strange flesh, are set forth for an example, suffering the vengeance of eternal fire.

2Pe 2:6 And turning the cities of Sodom and Gomorrah into ashes condemned *them* with an overthrow, making *them* an ensample unto those that after should live ungodly;

2Pe 2:7 And delivered just Lot, vexed with the filthy conversation of the wicked:

2Pe 2:8 (For that righteous man dwelling among them, in seeing and hearing, vexed *his* righteous soul from day to day with *their* unlawful deeds;)

The upheavals of violence and perversion are definitely the signs of moving closer towards the coming of Christ, but what I love to meditate on are not the evils of our day, but rather what I would term as "THE MIDDLE OF THE SANDWICH."

The middle of the sandwich is defined in my way of thinking by two outside ends or slices of bread. On one side, you have the wonderful promise by Christ of His return. On the other side, you have the unpleasant promises of mayhem in the earth prior to His return, and it is this chaos that is pressing us ever closer to the end. Right in the middle of this sandwich, we see the promise of His spiritual outpouring on the earth like never before!

This spiritual outpouring has been termed REVIVAL, JOEL'S ARMY, or THE END-TIME HARVEST. It has been spelled out to us through many different scriptures, and now by many different present day-speaking prophecies.

The middle of the sandwich, or revival, is our present joy in the Lord. Our assignment and the promises of empowerment within that assignment are stealing all the thunder away from the present chaos, because we are living in the joy of the coming finest hour of the Church. Satan is furious because he knows his days are truly numbered. And our assignment is not to focus on our surroundings, but rather to stay laser focused in prayer and fasting to receive by our intercession this spiritual outpouring.

Between the chaos and His coming is a beautiful filet mignon in the Spirit called REVIVAL. It is not worth our time nor our spiritual energy to come out of prayer and focus long enough on the present to become distracted by the spiraling downfall of this world. Our joy is not from this world, nor can it be subtracted by anything happening in this world.

The Bible also truly teaches us to pray for those who are in authority over us.

1Ti 2:1 I exhort therefore, that, first of all, supplications, prayers, intercessions, *and* giving of thanks, be made for all men;

1Ti 2:2 For kings, and *for* all that are in authority; that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and honesty.

1Ti 2:3 For this *is* good and acceptable in the sight of God our Saviour;

I encourage you to please pray for our president and for our nation, but remember this – in the end, we are not called to save the destruction of a democracy (one I wholeheartedly stand for), nor are we called to save the destruction of any political party. We are called to promote His spiritual Kingdom in the earth towards receiving revival, and this Kingdom is one that will never be destroyed! Amen! And Glory to God!
