Merry Christmas & the Presidential Election

This morning December 18, 2020, after an extended time of prayer and fellowship with the Lord, I surprisingly received some very specific instructions. The Lord instructed me to write a letter to one of our U.S. Republican senators from Florida in regards to helping President Trump be reinstated as our rightful president. He immediately showed me what to do and how simple it would be.

I will not go into lengthy detail, but many of you may know that on January 6, 2021, both the House and the Senate will meet to certify the elector vote for the presidency of the United States. Vice President Mike Pence will preside over that meeting. If any one House member along with any one senator refuses to accept the elector vote based on suspicions of a fraudulent election, it will send both chambers of Congress into an extended debate.
