## **The War With 2 Parts**

Dear Friend,

Recently, I have been teaching a series called “The War With 2 Parts.” The Lord has had me defining a spiritual war contained within the body of Christ. The “end-time Church” can best be described as a spiritual army. I like to call this army “Joel’s Army” in respect to the prophet Joel’s prophecy concerning the Church in the last days prior to the coming of Christ.

If ever there was a New Testament war manual, it would have to be the book of Ephesians. Ephesians covers numerous subjects, but in many ways they are all tied together to equip the New Testament saint for true spiritual warfare. The end result of this warfare is to pull down the influence of satanic principalities over a region or city for the purpose of a Revival atmosphere.

Many Christians want to take authority over Satan in regards to their city, but yet fail to win the first and most important part of this spiritual warfare, which is dominion over their flesh.

Jesus understood His assignment as an obedient son. His assignment was not just to provide the spiritual redemption for mankind through His death and resurrection, but it was also to crush every effect of Satan’s dominion over mankind.

**Act 10:38** How God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Ghost and with power: who went about doing good, and healing all that were oppressed of the devil; for God was with him.

**1Jn 3:8** He that committeth sin is of the devil; for the devil sinneth from the beginning. For this purpose the Son of God was manifested, that he might destroy the works of the devil.

The book of Ephesians is comprised of six chapters. About halfway through the sixth chapter, Paul recognizes a spiritual warfare that the Church is engaged in with satanic forces.

**Eph 6:10** Finally, my brethren, be strong in the Lord, and in the power of his might.

**Eph 6:11** Put on the whole armour of God, that ye may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil.

**Eph 6:12** For we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high *places*.

**Eph 6:13** Wherefore take unto you the whole armour of God, that ye may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand.

**Eph 6:14** Stand therefore, having your loins girt about with truth, and having on the breastplate of righteousness;

**Eph 6:15** And your feet shod with the preparation of the gospel of peace;

**Eph 6:16** Above all, taking the shield of faith, wherewith ye shall be able to quench all the fiery darts of the wicked.

**Eph 6:17** And take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God:

**Eph 6:18** Praying always with all prayer and supplication in the Spirit, and watching thereunto with all perseverance and supplication for all saints.

In verse 10 we see that the very first word is “Finally.” The simple word definition in the original greek language can mean “something remaining (adverbially): -besides, finally, furthermore, (from) henceforth, moreover, now, + it remaineth, then.”

Paul is not just ending his letter with his final thoughts, but rather is wrapping everything together from previous chapters to be able to say in essence, “Furthermore, because I have said all these other things, let us ‘finally’ launch this spiritual warfare.”

The amazing part to me is that Paul spent five and a half chapters of a six chapter epistle on Christian character regarding how to equip the spiritual soldier for true spiritual warfare. If the first war in regards to Christian character is not won, then we have no chance of defeating spirits of darkness that fight invasions of light coming from Revival.

The book of Ephesians is written to the Church. So, everything that Paul wrote in the first five and a half chapters applies to Christians. The list below is a representation of the things that Paul listed as a result of living a crucified Christian life. This list is not an exhaustive list, nor is it necessarily in perfect sequential order. It is not said in the King James, but our present day vernacular:

- Develop in the fullness of God’s love
- Grow up in doctrine
- Speak the truth in love
- Put off the old man
- Put on the new man
- Don’t lie to each other
- Don’t sin when you’re angry
- Don’t hold grudges
- Don’t steal
- Don’t be lazy
- Don’t have corrupt conversations
- Edify one another with your words
- Don’t grieve the Holy Spirit
- Don’t be bitter
- Don’t live in anger
- Don’t clamor (complain)
- Don’t speak evil
- Put away all malice
- Be kind to one another
- Be tenderhearted to one another

- Forgive everyone because God forgave us
- Don't fornicate
- Don't be unclean
- Don't covet
- Don't ever let it be reported that any of these things are going on
- Don't be filthy
- Don't talk foolishly
- Don't tell dirty jokes
- Don't give yourself to prostitution
- Don't be an idol worshiper
- Don't listen to anyone who tells you these things are okay
- Wake up from spiritual lethargy
- Use your time wisely for Kingdom purposes
- Become spiritually intoxicated through worship
- Submit to one another in humility
- Wives love your husbands
- Husbands love your wives
- Children love your parents
- Parents love your children
- Employees respect your employers
- Employers respect your employees

All of the things listed above can be found in the previous verses leading up to chapter 6. As I said, this is not an exhaustive list, but it gives us a strong understanding of how Paul came to the defining moment in which he used the word "FINALLY" in chapter 6 to describe true spiritual warfare.

If the first war is won in Christian character, then putting on the armor of God (which is all these things) is done with great ease. Satan has no defense against the true armor of God.

Please understand above all that no one of themselves is perfect in all of these things. We are not supposed to live in a legalistic mentality as the Old Testament saints did when they had to rehearse the law and keep it always before their face so as not to transgress. But ours is a walk of the spirit and of power! Our simple agreement with the "NEW MAN" (the spiritual you) to yield yourself daily will ultimately fulfill all of these things!

I like simple! And I believe that Paul gave us the simplest equation to walking in all of this Christian character.

**Eph 3:16** That he would grant you, according to the riches of his glory, to be strengthened with might by his Spirit in the inner man;

**Eph 3:17** That Christ may dwell in your hearts by faith; that ye, being rooted and grounded in love,

**Eph 3:18** May be able to comprehend with all saints what *is* the breadth, and length, and depth, and height;

**Eph 3:19** And to know the love of Christ, which passeth knowledge, that ye might be filled with all the fulness of God.

If I understand this correctly, all of the fullness of God is fulfilled in us by walking in the love of God. All of the dos and don'ts of our Christian character are fulfilled without thought if we just seek to be perfected in the love of God.

It is from this platform of Christian character that the greatest spiritual army that the world has ever seen will launch an end-time war that will defeat Satan with a great spiritual harvest of billions of souls.
