Humility is Yieldedness – September 2022 Letter

Dear Friend,

In this letter, we want to focus our attention on a short prophetic word that the Lord recently gave us concerning humility and yieldedness. Before we do, let's look at something that Jesus had to say concerning obedience to His instructions.

<u>Luke 6:46</u> And why call ye me, Lord, Lord, and do not the things which I say?

<u>Luke 6:47</u> Whosoever cometh to me, and heareth my sayings, and doeth them, I will shew you to whom he is like:

<u>Luke 6:48</u> He is like a man which built an house, and digged deep, and laid the foundation on a rock: and when the flood arose, the stream beat vehemently upon that house, and could not shake it: for it was founded upon a rock.

<u>Luke 6:49</u> But he that heareth, and doeth not, is like a man that without a foundation built an house upon the earth; against which the stream did beat vehemently, and immediately it fell; and the ruin of that house was great.

It's interesting to note in verse 46 that Jesus says people will approach Him by saying, "Lord, Lord," but will not do what He instructs them to do. The first "Lord" in this double term is a simple acknowledgment of His overall supremacy. The second "Lord" is an acknowledgment of His personalized supremacy in our individual life. It is as if the one coming says, "Lord, You are the Supreme Commander, and I will personally do whatever you tell me to do." For the person to make such an introductory statement and then not follow through with obeying His instructions presents a quandary to Jesus. This is why He asks, "Why would you do such a thing?" Now, let's look at this recent prophetic word.

Humility is Yieldedness

Prophecy220904 – September 4, 2022

There is, says the Lord, a humility that comes not precipitated by the flesh or the emotions, or even the actions or demeanor of the body or the facial expressions. It's an inward place of the heart, says the Spirit of Grace. It is a place of bowing the knee of the heart. The pretense seen of men has nothing to do with this place. It is a yieldedness to My instruction. My definition of humility is a yieldedness to My instruction, to be obedient in the things that I've told you to do and instructed you to do, says the Spirit of the Lord. So, with heart that is open, as best as you can, ask for more of this. For the further you go, the more you'll be engaged in this place of bowing the knee of your heart to Me, says the Spirit of the Lord. And I'll turn your thirty into sixty, and I'll turn your sixty into seventy, and eighty, and ninety, and a hundred fold

before this life is over. You'll enjoy, because you continued to hear instruction and follow instruction and be obedient unto the things in which I said, says the Spirit of Grace.

So, what are some of the things that we can take away from this prophecy in regards to humility and yieldedness?

- God-given humility is not based on human emotion or the physical demeanor of the body.
- True humility is bowing the knee of the heart.
- God defines true humility as a yieldedness and obedience to His instructions.
- The more we open our heart to this obedience, the more He will give us in the days ahead.
- Obedience to His instructions will yield continual fruit from thirty fold, all the way up to one hundred fold.

How are these instructions relevant to us for today? We are a Joshua-generation. We are to possess the land that is called Revival. We are to take from the enemy what has been stolen through many generations of false doctrine and watered-down religion. We have been given a specific mandate from God to go all the way in to His presence for the purpose of receiving an outpouring that turns into a WORLDWIDE REVIVAL. We have specifically been called the name "Joel's Army" by God, which is to say that we are the last and chosen generation to bring forth His harvest in the earth.

We, and that means you, have been asking God through prayer for years for this spiritual outpouring. If you are reading this letter, then it is evident that you are a part of this specific call from God. If you sit in one of our churches that teaches this call, watch our services or teachings online, or receive our teaching letters, then you are a part of this army of believers. You have incriminated yourself in a very positive way by association.

The Lord of Heaven Supreme, who is Jesus, has spoken as our personal Lord specifically through the Holy Ghost. The Holy Ghost continues to instruct us to "come away with Him" to a devoted time of prayer and intimacy.

We have to understand that from Jesus' point of view in Heaven, there is no possibility of Revival without the birthing process of extended prayer. Someone once asked the question, "How many different ways is God going to talk about devotion to prayer in our services?" That all depends on the question that He ask us: "And why call ye me, Lord, Lord, and do not the things which I say?"

Humility is yieldedness in obedience to His instructions. He has asked us to birth a Revival through prayer. Every man and woman's assignment is different, but everyone has an instruction from the Lord. Making an excuse for not praying because of some distraction is not an excuse. Choosing to say that a short Bible devotional at the coffee shop while eating a bagel on the way to work is our prayer time is not yielding to the present instructions of devoted prayer.

For some Christians, this type of commitment could seem to be an overreach of what they would determine as a devoted Christian life, but for you and I who are "called for such a time as this," this is our very life substance. Our life is not only to acknowledge Him as Lord, but to humble ourselves in obedience to His instructions. I am confident that by His grace, you and I will complete our course. And we will humble ourselves and yield to the instruction of the Lord of Heaven.
