### **The Path is Greater Than the End Result – August Letter 2023**

**Proverbs 4:18** But the path of the just *is* as the shining light, that shineth more and more unto the perfect day.

Dear Friend,

The above verse describes something pretty incredible. It's actually telling us that the path of the righteous man continually increases in light until it produces the end result of the perfect.

I was 37 years and two months old when God came and got me for full-time ministry. You might say I had been on the path of righteousness pretty much all of my life, but in March of 1997, the path became brighter towards a more perfect day.

I was attending a Prayer and Power Conference at the Family Prayer Center in Tulsa, Oklahoma hosted by Pastor Dave Roberson. I knew that I had a full-time call for the ministry on my life, but there always seemed to be too many excuses why I couldn't start.

The first service started and there was a wonderful presence of God in the room. The worship seemed to be beyond anything that I had ever experienced, but then something very unexpected happened. The presence of God actually went to another level. I'm sure I did not understand why at the time. A man that I had never met slowly paced himself in a humble fashion across the front of the church and ascended to the stage. "Could this be Dave Roberson?" I thought to myself. Up until this point, I had only heard his voice on cassette tapes. Once he began to speak, I knew it was him, and something incredible began to happen. Moment by moment, my heart began to be crushed with an insatiable desire for more of God. I had to have what this man had. I had to have the same type of intimacy with God that would produce this kind of presence. I did not want it for the purpose of demonstration. I wanted it for the purpose of knowing God face-to-face.

After the service, I had to be alone with God. I remember weeping and crying out and saying, "God, I will do anything for this. Show me the path to change my life from where I'm at to where You want me to be." God did not speak to me in an audible voice, but it was just as strong on the inside as any voice that could be heard from without. He said, "If you will go back home and pray this amount of hours in tongues each day nonstop and fast each quarter this amount of days, I will deliver you into full-time ministry." All I can say is what Paul said in Acts chapter 26 when he rehearsed his obedience to the call before King Agrippa.

**Acts 26:19** Whereupon, O king Agrippa, I was not disobedient unto the heavenly vision.

I can also say by the grace of God that I was not disobedient to the "heavenly vision" given to me on this path. And because I continued on the path, it burned brighter and brighter into a more

perfect day. By August 1997, I moved from the city where I was living to Immokalee, Florida where I have been pastoring full time for the past 26 years.

That's my testimony, but what about yours? God is no respecter of persons. Your testimony and call is just as important to God as mine. God holds you and your destiny so close to His heart. God is absolutely faithful to each one of us to bring us into His perfect will and call for our lives. The question is, how much are we engaged on the path? The path is not some abstract idea where we have to guess how to get there, but it is perfectly laid out before us. God has instructed us on this path of how to intimately set aside our lives daily to become engaged towards a "more perfect day."

Pastor Dave Roberson would often say, "The path to the miracle is just as sovereign and perfect as the miracle itself." We could say it like this: "The path to the miracle outpouring of Revival is just as sovereign and perfect as the Revival itself." But I want to venture out a little further and say it like this: "The path that we are on towards Revival is even greater than the Revival itself." Why? Because it is the thing that actually produces the end result. Whatever produces something is greater than what is produced because by it (the path), something came into existence.

Spending time in the presence of your Heavenly Father and crying out, "Abba" (Daddy God), I want to know You. I want to know You face to face" – This is the path! Spending time praying the mysteries in tongues, this is the path! Becoming entrenched in the meditation of His Word, this is the path! Loving Him enough to go without food in fasting, this is the path! And on this path, our light is burning brighter and brighter until the perfect day of our sharing together in the outpouring of Revival.

We do not have to wait for the notable miracles of Revival to understand that the greater miracle is happening daily as you engage on this path. Every moment that you spend is a miracle taking place. Every moment that you spend is bending and shaping your life towards the end result. Pastor Dave Roberson would often say, "The plan of God for each individual does not come as a whim to be guessed at, but it grows like a tree towards the sunshine as we pray the mysteries in tongues." Your life is a life of certainty, and as we go forward towards the perfect day of Revival, please know that the path is just as perfect as the end result. And together, our paths will burn brighter and brighter into that perfect day.

This month of August celebrates 26 years of our full-time ministry here in Immokalee. Together, you and I have been going forward to bring about something that the earth has not seen in many centuries. We have a call and a distinct mission. Candy and I can never thank you enough for helping us realize through your prayers and giving this call for Revival. I pray that your finances are blessed and that your bodies are healed and healthy. I pray that your mind and emotions are filled with the joy and peace of God. I pray that your families are covered with the hedge of His love. But most of all, I pray that you continue on the path that "shines brighter and brighter unto a more perfect day."
