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What is Your Starry Sky? – August Letter 2026

Dear Friend,

Many years ago, I was hunting with a few other men in South Texas. We were hunting near the Big Bend National Park not far from the Rio Grande that separates the U.S. from Mexico.

One of the things that amazed me the most, besides the beautiful mountain desert terrain, was the night sky. Because there was no light pollution from any surrounding cities, the sky was brilliant with stars. I saw stars that I had never seen in my life while living in the state of Florida. The stars looked like millions of diamonds on a black velvet background. It looked as if I could reach up and swipe through them with my hand at any moment. When I think about this experience, I am reminded of another experience in the Word of God that Abraham, the father of the Jewish nation, once had with a starry sky.

Before Abraham's name was changed in Genesis chapter 17, his name was Abram. God had called him away from his father's house and had promised to make a great nation from him. Abram had only one problem – he had no children.

Genesis 12:1 Now the LORD had said unto Abram, Get thee out of thy country, and from thy kindred, and from thy father's house, unto a land that I will shew thee:

Genesis 12:2 And I will make of thee a great nation, and I will bless thee, and make thy name great; and thou shalt be a blessing:

Genesis 12:3 And I will bless them that bless thee, and curse him that curseth thee: and in thee shall all families of the earth be blessed.

In Genesis chapter 15, Abram was having a hard time seeing how God could possibly accomplish His original promise to him while he still had no children. What happened next was Abram's effort to try and offer God a workable solution to keeping His promise.

Genesis 15:1 After these things the word of the LORD came unto Abram in a vision, saying, Fear not, Abram: I *am* thy shield, *and* thy exceeding great reward.

Genesis 15:2 And Abram said, Lord GOD, what wilt thou give me, seeing I go childless, and the steward of my house *is* this Eliezer of Damascus?

Genesis 15:3 And Abram said, Behold, to me thou hast given no seed: and, lo, one born in my house is mine heir.

I believe that Abram's hope was beginning to wane on ever having a child of his own to be his heir and create a family in the earth. But God who is the God of Hope had a plan. He had a vision of hope that He was about to impart to Abram's spirit until the promise came to pass.

Genesis 15:5 And he brought him forth abroad, and said, Look now toward heaven, and tell the stars, if thou be able to number them: and he said unto him, So shall thy seed be.

Genesis 15:6 And he believed in the LORD; and he counted it to him for righteousness.

What Abram saw in the desert that night was the same thing that I saw in the desert years ago – a starry sky that innumerable filled up the darkness with millions of glistening specks of light. To Abram, it was a vision of hope. No matter what the present circumstances seemed to dictate, the end result would be that the promise would come to pass.

I don't know what your present physical or natural circumstances seem to be, but I know a God of Hope who has a starry sky filled with His hope that He wants to share with you. Never give up on believing for your miracle or a miracle for someone else.

Proverbs 13:12 Hope deferred maketh the heart sick: but *when* the desire cometh, *it is* a tree of life.

When our hope of seeing the miracle manifest seems to take longer than we expected, this verse tells us that it can discourage the heart. But we must always remember that God is not the problem; the challenge is our belief. Believe me, God wants your miracle for you more than you do and He wants it now.

2 Corinthians 1:20 For all the promises of God in him *are* yea, and in him Amen, unto the glory of God by us.

What has God promised you through His Word or through the Holy Spirit speaking to you? What has God said concerning your healing, deliverance, prosperity, or ministry?

What is your starry sky of hope? What do you see through the vision of hope that will change your circumstances and life forever? God will help you create this place through intimacy in His presence and meditation and confession of His Word.

Romans 15:13 Now the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, that ye may abound in hope, through the power of the Holy Ghost.

The word “hope” here in this verse does not mean a wish. Godly hope is not a wish; it is an expectation. Godly hope built through a starry sky of God's Word and promises produces an expectation that something is about to happen.

Together, you and I share a starry sky filled with the expectant hope of the promised outpouring of God's Spirit that we call Revival. Individually, our starry sky is to know Jesus face-to-face with an ever-growing intimacy. You and I desire to be conformed into His image to the glory of the Father.

Remember to look up into the face of Jesus and into the power of His Word, because in it there is a starry sky filled with hope for your life.
